Unfortunately her wish never came true. It is a blatant fault & dogs with gay tails should not be bred on from. If you are going to breed, please breed to the Standard. It also never fails to amaze me that people say they have not entered as they have been told, I do not like their dog & will do nothing for them. Wrong. Nice to see there were no light eyes, which is a considerable improvement from what I have observed recently. Bend of stifles were present which is also a bonus. Plenty nice youngsters coming through.

PD (1) 1 Williamson's Kalabagh Tornado, nice strong head & good dark eye. Lovely lay of shoulder. Good bend of stifle, just a little bit gangly at the moment. Should have a bright future. **JD** (3) 1 Taylor's Ichbin Jester of Tattay, very striking dog. Superb head & dark eye. Good layback of shoulder & wonderful depth of chest which is sadly lacking these days. Beautiful bend of stifle. Very mature dog, delighted to award him RCC; 2 Williamson's Celtaur Quileute Shaman, not the quality of 1, but given time, may improve in all departments. Not my type at all; 3 Murdoch's Celtaur Quartz Stone. **PGD** (2) 1 Murdoch's Celtaur Lock Glashan, good head & dark eye. Nice depth of chest but not overdone in any way. Well within the Standard as regards to size. Very compact, neat dog. Moved exceptionally well around the nice large ring, with correct tail set & carriage. CC; 2 Hewitt's Brockchime Be A Betta Boy, another larger dog, nicely made. Good head & depth of chest. Unfortunately, I cannot forgive such a gay tail. **LD** (1) 1 Webb's Trumorlund Anthony, anyone who says they can tell construction from the side of the ring without actually going over a dog, is talking rubbish. This dog was very well made & could have done better with a little bit of trimming & training. I hope this lady perseveres. **OD** (0).

PB (1) 1 Hewitt's Brockchime Luna, beautifully made bitch. Lovely layback of shoulder. Not overdone in any way. Moved well around the ring. Will just have to watch as she has already inherited her father's fault & not everyone is capable of hiding faults. Apart from that, she should have a bright future. BP. **JB** (2) 1 Wheldon's Ichbin Kwanita, what a sweetheart. Nice head & dark eye. Good lay of shoulder. Depth of chest is coming & coat will too. Nice bend of stifle & moved around the ring better than most on the day. RCC; 2 Butler's Ichbin Jaunty of Jendella's, another nice bitch. Played her owner up a little but I would never penalise a youngster for this as they all take different lengths of time to get themselves together. Should have a bright future. **PGB** (2,1) 1 Pilkington's Tarkanya Daisy's Daydream of Baycross, nice head & eye. Better to go over than watch from the ringside. Nice mover. **LB** (4,1) 1 Darby's Brockchime Besta Both to Incadar, my star of the day. I have often wondered why this bitch was/was not placed. Now I know. She hides a multitude of good properties. Good head & eye. Nice layback of shoulder. Nice tuck up. Adequate bend of stifle. Moved well around the ring. Delighted to award her, her 2nd CC & BOB. Third should not be too far away; 2 Reader's Kalimna April Fool, pretty bitch, not quite on top form today but has all the attributes required; 3 Williamson's Celtaur Gaidhlig Samhradh at Kalabagh. **OB** (1) 1 Williamson's Celtaur Speckled Garnet, another nice bitch from

this kennel. Just not quite the type I prefer, but many will have a different opinion to mine, & I am sure, she will do well in the future. **VB** (1) 1 Butler's Gorsebank Barnoness Jasmine of Jendella's, nice bitch, not quite the eye set, I prefer, but moved very well round the ring for her age. Some of these older dogs put the youngsters to shame & they are a credit to their owners.
